I say it is fabulous because I have been doing this job for two years and absolutely adore it - but am now leaving to head back to Canada to be closer to my baby granddaughter. This job offers a lot of autonomy, room for creativity and new ideas, and the BEST team of co-workers! Here is what we hope to find in our next chaplain/spiritual advisor:

- Salary/pay TBD depending on hours, credentials etc.
- A master's degree in divinity, theology, religious studies or related
- Completion of clinical pastoral education (CPE) units
- Studies in Interfaith spiritual care and ministry
- Ordination (and clergy in good standing status with ordaining body)
- Training and experience in crisis intervention
- Training and experience in grief and bereavement counseling
- Training and experience in family support/counseling
- Experience working with and supporting staff (doctors, nurses, admin, home health aids, social workers, and all other staff)
- Experience in creation of workshops, leading groups, lecturing
- Experience creating, running and caring for participants in "debriefing" circles (safe space in which Hospice staff can "unwind", share grief and heal their own work-related stress and trauma)

In addition, we hope our spiritual advisor will:

- Have and share with staff, patients and families, practices for self-care (and have solid self-care practices themself!)
- Be an example of open heartedness and open mindedness, welcoming all religious/spiritual beliefs and practices
- Be a grounded presence in times of stress for staff, patients and families
- Have a deep familiarity and comfort with the process of death and dying
- Have a flexible schedule
- Have reliable transportation and be comfortable with and willing to drive often many miles to see our patients and families (we sometimes travel 90+ minutes to see our families)
- Not only have, but also be a central force in creating, a warm and healthy team spirit
- Able to work as a team member, and able to lead when leadership is called for

Spiritual Advisor is responsible for:

- Spiritual and general care of patients, their families and our hospice staff
- Preparing and opening Interdisciplinary Team Meetings (IDT's every two weeks, mandatory)
- Working with supervisor to plan and offer staff gatherings for debriefing and regeneration

- Working with lead clinician (doctor) to develop, create, and facilitate "Spirituality in Healthcare" workshops
- Maintaining updated "Relias" trainings (mandatory online hospice training courses)
- Maintaining health requirements (flu shots, wearing PPE etc)

If you are interested, but not quite 'ALL THAT' that is listed above, don't let that stop you from inquiring!! Simply being a fabulous human is a lot of weight on the "yes" side of the scale! Charting hospice visits in "Healthwise" charting system (training provided onsite)
